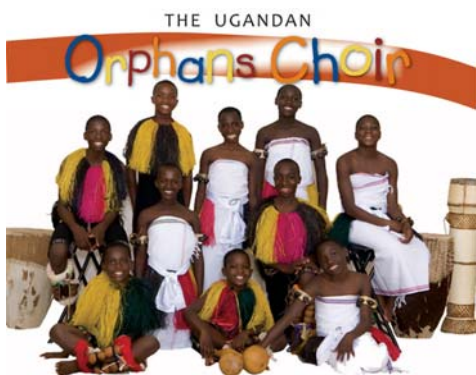

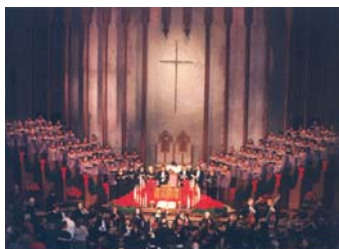

While Handel (1685-1759) was raised and trained in Germany, he experienced compositional mastery and commercial success as a young adult in Italy. He was then perfectly prepared to move to the richest cultural center in Europe at that time – London – to make his mark on the world. For almost fifty years, Handel produced hundreds of great works that synthesized the best elements of the musical styles of his day that appealed to his cosmopolitan audience. Handel was not just writing for Londoners, Germans, Italians, etc., however; his music has resonated with all generations up to our own time. One example of *Messiah's* influence on future generations was reflected in Beethoven's love for the work. He was so impressed with *Messiah* that he spent days copying it note for note so that he could learn its secrets.

An electric drive and rhythmic certainty sets Mary Preston apart as one of the finest concert organists of her generation. A true testament to her exquisite musicianship, popularity among her colleagues, and demand as a recitalist and concerto soloist, she has performed widely throughout North America and Europe. Ms. Preston graduated with honors and received her Master of Music degree from the University of North Texas as a student of Charles Brown and continued post-graduate study with Russell Saunders at the Eastman School of Music. She is Resident Organist of the Dallas Symphony and Curator of the celebrated Lay Family Concert Organ, Op. 100, built by C.B. Fisk, Inc. in the Meyerson Symphony Hall, Dallas. Ms. Preston's performances and recordings have received rave reviews and been heard numerous times on National Public Radio's *Pipedreams*. Ms. Preston also serves as Director of Music and Organist at St. John's Episcopal Church in Dallas.
