The wedding ring is a classic pattern widely popular in the 1930's when feed sacks were the most common material used. This class is an intermediate quilting class. We will discuss piecing, strip piecing and paper piecing. Projects will include a wall hanging, table runner and a queen size quilt.

The afternoon session will feature Scrap or Crazy quilting. Frugal homemakers were famous for using every scrap of material available and most ended up in a quilt. This class is for the novice as well as experienced quilters. We will discuss the scrap quilts Quilting for Others have made using the wide assortment of materials that have been donated over the years. We will explore piecing, foundation piecing and paper piecing as well as general quilt making.

Participants will need general sewing supplies such as sewing machine, thread, scissors. We have only two sewing machines available, so you are encouraged to bring your own. We will arrange assistants to help you bring the machines up to the classroom if needed. Yardage for quilts will be discussed during the first class so plan to bring supplies and material to the second class.

Carol has been teaching quilt making for many years. She is a graduate of the University of Tulsa with a degree in Secondary Mathematics, and a passion for sewing. Her quilts have received rewards from quilt shows in Southern California and one was a semi-finalist at an International Quilt Show. Lately, most of her quilting has been for the organization "Quilting for Others" which donates quilts throughout the Tulsa area.
