Charter for B.A. family update Compassion to begin Nov. 15

"Do unto others what you would like to be done to you," the Golden Rule, is found in some form in all major religions.

A special interfaith event will celebrate the launching of noted author Karen Armstrong's **Charter for Compassion**, based on the Golden Rule, on Sunday, Nov. 15 at 3 p.m. at Boston Avenue. The free event is sponsored by the Faith Club Committee, the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice, and Tulsa City-County Library.

The celebration will feature a reading of the Charter for Compassion; children reciting the Golden Rule in their native language, religion and ethnic dress; interfaith music; and Armstrong's Charter for Compassion talk.

In 2008 she won the \$100,000 TED Prize and the granting of "One Wish to Change the World." Her wish: help to create Charter for Compassion.

Her wish comes true with the worldwide launching of the Charter and celebratory events Nov. 13-19. The charter joins voices from all cultures and religions, and reminds the world of core principles of compassion.

Babb is an entertaining, informative speaker who has taught radio and television audiences and helped to establish stalker legislation in California. She will teach women to protect themselves in a various situations.

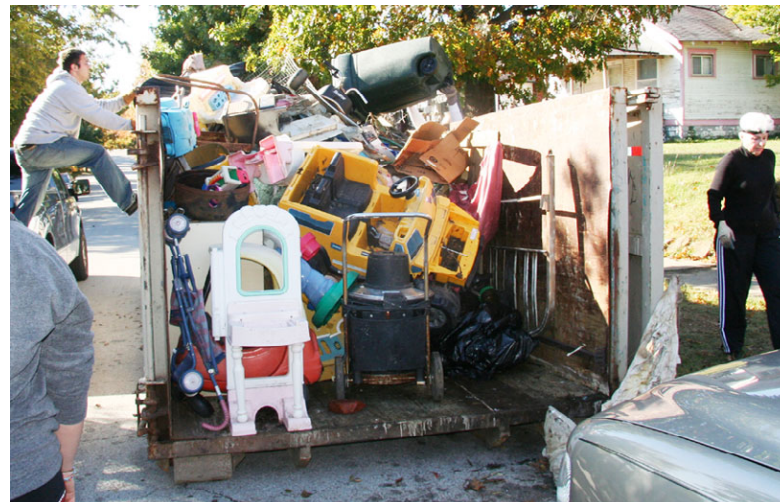
