## Rabbi Funnye to speak at M. L. King Service Sunday

Rabbi Capers C. Funnye, Jr., will be the guest speaker at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemoration Service this year. A larger-than-usual crowd is expected for the service, which will be held at Boston Avenue this Sunday, January 17, at 6:00 p.m.

Rabbi Funnye leads a multi-ethnic congregation in Chicago's Marquette Park, which was the site of a Martin Luther King, Jr., march that ended within just a few blocks after bricks and bottles were

thrown at the marchers.

Rabbi Funnye, the country's best-known black rabbi, has dedicated himself to uniting Jews of all ethnicities in the U.S. and Africa. He is a cousin to Michelle Obama.

Another highlight of the service is the presentation of Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech, given by the winner of the high school oratory competition, and presentation of the "Keeping the Dream Alive" Award.

A candlelight processional will precede the service, and all are invited to participate. The procession forms at 5:15 p.m. at Seventh and Cincinnati, and participants can ride a shuttle from the church at 4:45. All are asked to bring a flashlight. *(More information on page 4A)*

## From the Pastor's Study

*Mouzon Biggs, Jr.*

A well-known cliché says, "seeing is believing." However, when faith is involved, it is not always possible to "see."

Next Sunday's sermon will be based on *John 1:29-42*. Note the witness of John the baptizer, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world ... I myself did not know him."

Two verses later John says again, "I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me .. said to me, 'He on whom you see the spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.'"

The next day John watched Jesus walk by and exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!"

John uses the verb "believe" ninety-six times in his Gospel. He wrote at least sixty years after the death and resurrection of Jesus, so he knows that those of us who read his Gospel must come to "believe" without ever having "seen" Jesus.

It is clear from this first chapter of his Gospel that he wants us to "believe" that Jesus was the Lamb of God in order to receive his gift of life, life abundant, and life everlasting.

I am calling the sermon, "SEEING IS BELIEVING? AND, BELIEVING BEFORE SEEING?"

## Canadian organist to present Elder Recital next Sunday

Isabelle Demers, a Canadian-born organist whom reviewers have described as "a force of nature - a diminutive dynamo," will present the Fred Elder Recital next Sunday, January 24, at 6:00 p.m. A native of Québec, she is rapidly becoming recognized as one of North America's most outstanding organists.

The recital series was established in 1994 to honor Organist Emeritus Fred Elder on his 30th anniversary as organist at Boston

Avenue Church. Mr. Elder presented the inaugural recital in the series.

"Isabelle is packed with energy, creativity, and a love of music that just pours forth from her," says Dr. Susan Panciera. "She also has a wonderful sense of humor!"
