## Options make 2011 giving easy

With the end of the year quickly approaching, it's a good time to review ways that contributions can be given to the church and the advantages each one offers.

First, there are ways to enhance the tax benefit of a contribution. If you have reviewed your tax plan for 2010 and it would be helpful to prepay your 2011 pledge, the church can accept the contribution, give you tax credit in 2010 and spend the money in 2011. The church usually receives about 10% of the budget as prepaid pledges. This revenue is very helpful during the summer months when income traditionally declines.

Another way to help the church and yourself is with a gift of appreciated stock. If you have a stock certificate with your name on it, you can still give it to the church. A single-page "Third Party" *(See "Giving" on page 4A)*

Release" form is all it takes to convey the stock to the church. Stock can also be transferred electronically from your brokerage account to the church's account.

Either way, the stock will be immediately sold and the proceeds applied as your contribution. The best part is that you pay no taxes on the stock proceeds.

Third, regular giving can become more convenient through the use of automatic withdrawals from your checking account. Many church members have chosen this form of giving. It provides a consistent income for the church and frees the giver from writing checks and keeping track of contributions.

Boston Avenue's Service of Lessons and Carols was begun in 1977 by Organist Emeritus Fred Elder. The long shape, vaulted ceilings and hard marble surfaces of Great Hall provide acoustics much like those of the great cathedrals in Europe, and the service is patterned after one held annually at King's College Chapel in Cambridge, England. That service is broadcast worldwide on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

## Christmas offering meets variety of needs through TMM

Each year our church family makes a special offering at Christmas to help others with special needs. The offering supports a number of different agencies, local and worldwide.

One of the agencies through which our offering helps others is Tulsa Metropolitan Ministry. Dr. Bill Crowell chairs the TMM Board of Directors, and the Rev. Judy Bradford, who relates to our congregation, is the chaplain at TMM's Family Safety Center, where people in trouble can access victim services and emergency protective orders.

TMM begins its 75th year in 2011. Since its beginning as a ministerial alliance, the ministry has helped start the Day Center for the Homeless, Life Senior Services, Meals on Wheels, Youth Services of Tulsa, Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP), and more.

This past year TMM has helped address the needs of children, gangs in Tulsa, and issues related to gaming and gambling in Oklahoma through its Tulsa Talks program. In the coming year the ministry has plans to host classes for female inmates, especially those scheduled for release in the near future. It will also host opportunities for pastors and religious leaders to become better acquainted, and is partnering with the Oklahoma Conference for Community and Justice and others to help our community address interfaith issues such as Islamaphobia.
