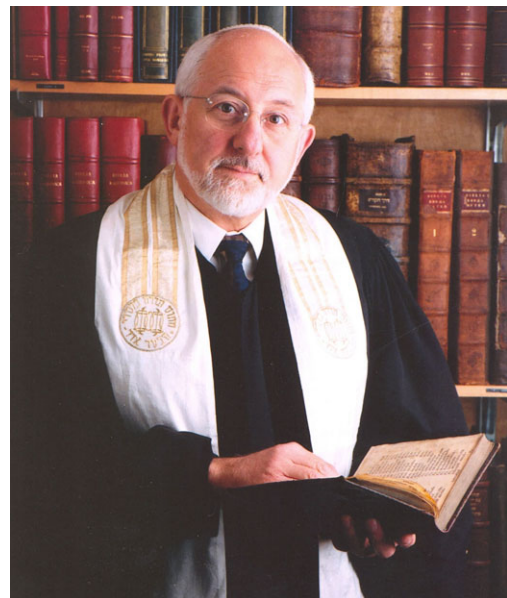

Barton Clinton Gordey Series begins next Sunday, February 21

Rabbi Sheldon Zimmerman, Rabbi of the Jewish Center of the Hamptons in East Hampton, New York, will be this year's Barton Clinton Gordey Series presenter. The series will be held February 21-23.

He will be examining stories that both faiths have in common - the stories of creation, Cain and Able, Moses and the Ten Commandments.

Rabbi Zimmerman has served as Rabbi of Central Synagogue in New York City and at Temple Emanu-El in Dallas, one of the largest Jewish congregations in North America.

He served for five years as President of Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion and headed all of its four campuses - Cincinnati, New York, Los Angeles and Jerusalem. Founded in 1875, it is the oldest rabbinical seminary in the United States and is currently the spiritual and educational center of Reform Judaism.

After leaving his position there, Rabbi Zimmerman headed Birth-

right Israel, a program that reaches across North America to provide free trips for young Jews, ages 18-26, to strengthen their faith and identity by visiting Israel.

He has also served as Vice President of Jewish Renaissance and Renewal of the United Jewish Communities, the umbrella organization of all community federations in North America.

Rabbi Zimmerman has been a visiting professor at Fordham University and at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, in Dallas. He was adjunct faculty at Hebrew Union College.

Rabbi Zimmerman was one of 16 chosen to travel with Vice President Al Gore to Warsaw for the 50th anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising.

He has published many articles and is the author of *Children's and Young Family's Prayer Books for the Sabbath and the Festivals*.

Rabbi Zimmerman has worked extensively with recovering alcoholics. He created the first nonsectarian Alcoholics Anonymous group to ever meet in a synagogue.

He will also speak on Friday evening, February 19, at Temple Israel at 7:30, and all are invited to attend that service as well.

Oberammergau trip deadline set

April 15, 2010, is the new registration deadline for this summer's Oklahoma Conference trip to see the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany.

Presented for one season every ten years, this is the oldest continuous passion play in the world. It dates from 1634.

The pilgrimage departing August 10 from Tulsa and OKC, will feature Bishop and Ms. Robert Hayes as spiritual leaders with Warren and Lynette Danskin as hosts. The nine-day trip includes visits to Mad King Ludwig's castles Linderhof and Neuschwanstein (the model on which the Disneyland castle was designed), Innsbruck, Dachau concentration camp, Salzburg (Mozart's hometown), and traveling the ancient Brenner Pass in Italy to Bressanone, plus beautiful abbeys and churches. These are day trips from our chalet in Austria, so there will be no need for packing and repacking.

Dr. Danskin says, "On the day we attend the play, we'll have the morning free for shopping in the charming village of Oberammergau. We'll watch the play with full orchestra and chorus in the afternoon, then have a leisurely dinner and return to the theatre to finish the play in the evening."

Each kit should consist of a sealed one-gallon plastic (preferably freezer) bag filled with the following NEW items only. Kits may be brought to church to be sent on to UMCOR:

- * 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27". No kitchen towels.)
- * 1 washcloth
- * 1 comb (large and sturdy, not pocket-sized)
- * 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards)
- * 1 bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. and up)
- * 1 toothbrush (single adult brush only in original wrapper)
- * 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages
- * 6 ounces or larger toothpaste with an expiration date no earlier than February, 2011
