## Rabbi Zimmerman to share insights into great Bible stories in Barton Clinton Gordey Series

"I'm just delighted to come," says Rabbi Sheldon Zimmerman, our Barton Clinton Gordey presenter. "It's wonderful when Jews and Christians get together, but we don't study enough together. I hope to share some Jewish insights into some of the texts we have in common."

Rabbi Zimmerman's first presentation will be given Sunday morning in both worship services, then he will continue Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evenings at 7:00 p.m. He has asked to be down front with a podium and whiteboard so that the evening sessions will be more of a classroom setting.

"As we look at these texts, we will seek to understand what we take for granted, what we might be missing. We will work to discover how the early listeners might have understood them."

"On Sunday morning we'll look at the creation story. Early in that story God says, "Let there be light," but he doesn't create the sun, moon and stars until later. What are we missing here?"

"Sunday evening we'll look at the first question that humans ask of God, 'Am I my brother's keeper?' Cain doesn't get an answer from God, but the wonderful patriarchal stories that follow do suggest an answer, and we will seek to find it."

"On Monday and Tuesday evenings we'll take a fresh look at the stories of Moses and the Ten Commandments and ask similar questions."

Rabbi Zimmerman will also be speaking at Temple Israel, 2004 East 22nd Place, on Friday evening at 7:30. All are invited to attend that service.

A reception will follow all evening presentations. Child care is available.

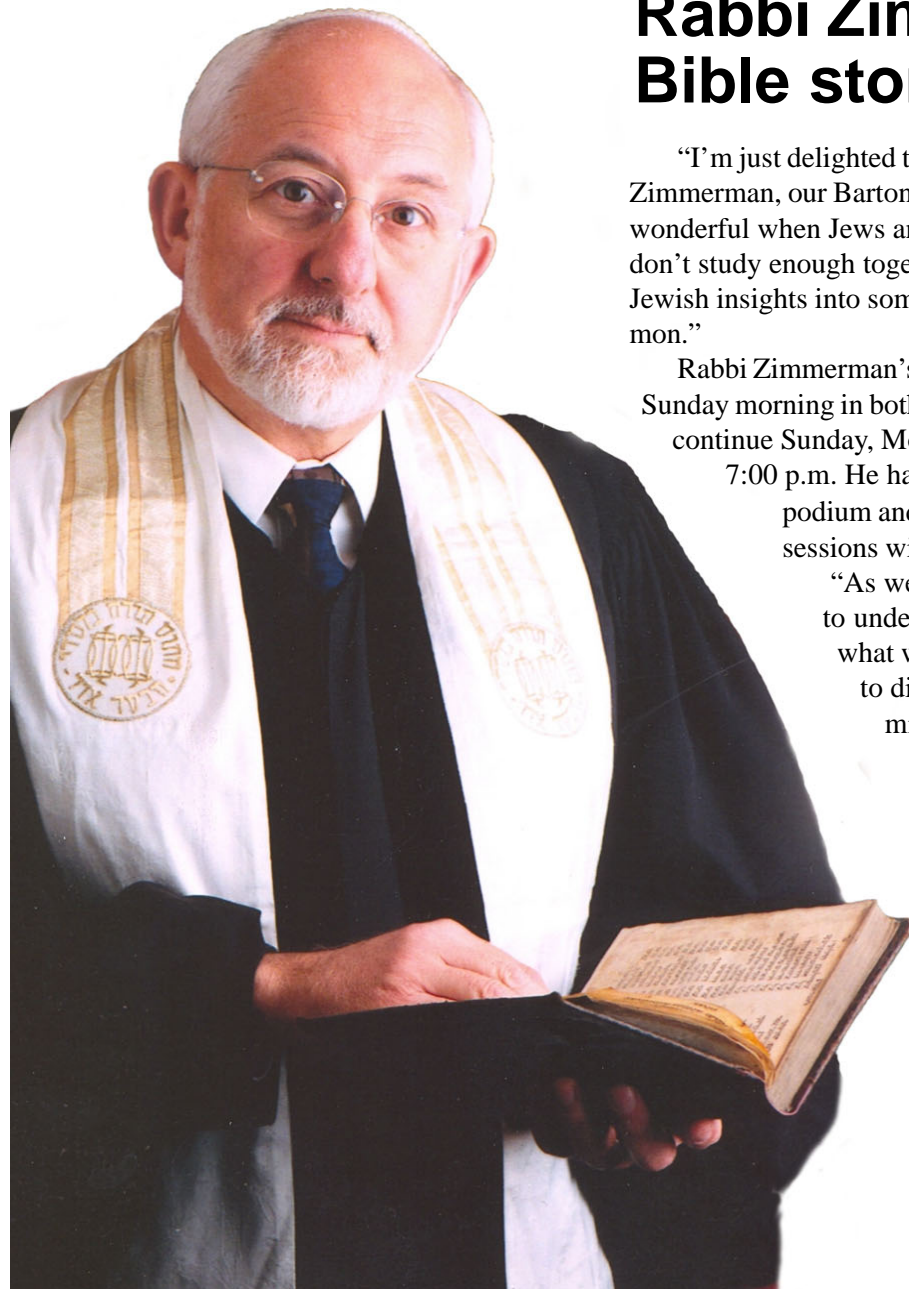
